*June 1*

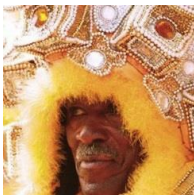
From the Outer Banks to the Southern Highlands, southerners of all walks of life lend their voices to a universal portrait of language and identity.
